

- Professor Office Hours

 - Will attend twice a week and will count toward course attendance

Course Credit

Winthrop Language Courses are APweighted, dual credit accrual courses.

Upon successful completion student earn:

- One Carnegie unit of high school credit
- Three hours of Winthrop University college credit



Must meet 2 of the 3 criteria while in high school:

- 3.0+ final high school GPA
- Minimum SAT score of 1100 on reading & math section OR ACT score of 22+
- Graduated in the top 30% of your high school class
- Life Scholarship is \$5,000 per year

To keep your life scholarship while at a SC college/university:

• 3.0 + GPA and must take 30 credit-hours per year





STAMP Assessment

March 28th-30th:

Current 9th grade students will take the STAMP assessment in class.

May 10th: AP Spanish Test
May 11th: AP French Text
May 15th-18th: STAMP retest





What if I don't meet eligibility requirements?

Students should take the prerequisite course, Spanish/French 202: Intermediate French or Spanish at an accredited institution of higher education in the Summer of 2023

- The cost of this course, plus necessary textbooks and materials, will need to be paid by the family of the student. Upon successful completion of French/Spanish 202, the student will then be able to apply to enroll in the French or Spanish 250 dual credit course with Winthrop University during the Fall 2023 semester and continue on track with his or her original cohort in the dual credit language courses offered at Rock Hill High School.
- If the French/Spanish 202 course is not offered during the summer at any of the acceptable institutions, the next viable option will be for the student to take the prerequisite course in Fall 2023 and enroll in the French or Spanish 250 course in Spring 2024.. This means the student will not be enrolled with his or her original cohort. This also means the student would potentially earn a maximum of 12 credit hours instead of the originally planned 18 hours.

How can I re-enroll?

- During IGP's inform your school counselor of your intent to continue for the **2023-24 academic year**.
- Must pass SPAN/FREN 310 with a C or higher
- Must maintain a 3.0 cumulative GPA at the high school level

2023-24 courses

Fall: Spanish/French 313
Spring: Spanish/French 385









- If you scored a **5 on STAMP**, apply and will be registered for course.
- If you scored less than a **5 on STAMP**, apply and if you do not earn a **4 or 5 on AP test**, you will be dropped from the course.

- 1) Full legal name
- 2) Permanent Home Address
- 3) Contact Information

- 5) Social Security Number*
 - SSN are registered with National Student Clearinghouse, the nation's trusted source for degree verification and enrollment
- 6) Proof of Citizenship/Legal Presence*
 - This policy has been adopted by the University to comply with section 59-101-403 of the South Carolina Code of Laws, which requires that lawful presence in United States is verified before enrollment at any public institution of higher education.
