
Women's Athletics Pioneer Judy Rose Inducted into S.C. Athletic Hall of Fame

Judy Wilkins Rose '74, the long-time athletic director for the University of North Carolina Charlotte, was recently honored as a 2022 inductee into the South Carolina Athletic Hall of Fame. Known as a pioneer in women's athletics, Rose spent 28 years as the Charlotte 49ers' director of athletics and more than 40 years in its athletics department. She retired in 2018 and, three years later, was awarded the James J. Corbett Memorial Award, the highest honor given in collegiate athletics administration by the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics. Read More>>
