Chuck Rey Named Athletic Director

During a June 24 meeting, the Winthrop Board of Trustees approved Interim President George Hynd's recommendation to appoint Chuck Rey as the university's athletic director. Rey has been serving in the interim athletic director role since December 2021. Rey will continue to oversee 17 Division I sports and a department that has set new records for departmental cumulative grade point average (GPA) each year since 2016-17, including a record-high 3.35 mark by the student-athlete population for the 2020-21 academic year. Karen Oremus Named Interim Dean of the College of Visual and Performing Arts




Winning Homecoming 2022 T-shirt Design Revealed
