We hope our 2024 Newsletter finds you well. This has been an eventful year in the Department of World Languages and Cultures, and for a host of positive reasons. We have continued to welcome new majors and minors to our program, and we have also welcomed the first cohorts of high school students from the Rock Hill School District's Dual Language Immersion program. These students have been taking Spanish or French in an immersion environment since kindergarten and can now enroll in our courses and earn college credit at Winthrop beginning in their sophomore year. We have been impressed by their level of proficiency, and their participation in our courses is a gift to our department and the University.

In addition to our traditional college students and the dual enrollment students, a number of retired community members regularly audit our courses and enrich the classroom environment with their enthusiasm for language learning. One of our regular auditors in French from the Rock Hill community, Stephen Turner, has just established a fund for students planning to study abroad in France. We are so grateful for Stephen's generosity! Contributions like this help ease the burden of foreign travel and would be a fabulous way for any alumni wishing to give back to their alma mater to help our current students!

Our language lab, which underwent an update just before the pandemic, has continued to adapt to the needs of our students with the help of our new Instructor of Spanish, Prof. Narada Diaz de Lang, who oversaw successful tutoring sessions, OPI practices (the oral proficiency exam taken by all our majors), not to mention very well-attended conversation hours for French and Spanish (more on these in the newsletter below).

The 2023-24 academic year was a typically busy one for faculty, who offered courses such as Love and Death in Hispanic Literature (Adam Glover), Paris and the Arts (Anna Igou), La Gran Cocina Latina (Valerie Jepson), Fairy Tales, Songs, and Comics (en français) (Scott Shinabargar), and the Spanish Film (Victoria Uricoechea).

This June, incoming first-year students are participating in orientation sessions and enrolling in language courses for the fall! We are enjoying the slower pace of summer and some summer travels as well, but we look forward to returning in the fall with new courses and energy for a new academic year ahead. 


Faculty Promotions
