NOTE: You may not enroll in ECON 103 (constitution) if you already received credit for ECON 215 & 216.

Technology: Met in the major by CSCI 101 and labs.

ACAD 101: Required for new freshman only.

Quantitative Skills / Natural Science: MATH 105 or 201; Natural Science w/ Lab; Choose additional Quantitative or Science course. Science requires 2 categories; selections on back.

NOTE: MATH 105 has a prerequisite of a 3 on the Math Placement Exam or a C- from MATH 151. MATH 151 may satisfy additional Quantitative Reasoning.

Social Science: ECON 215 and additional Social Science outside of ECON.

Humanities & Arts: Selections on back. 2 designators required.

Economics Major

Foundation: CSCI 101, 101B, 101D, and one lab from CSCI 101A, C, or P; QMTH 205 and 210

NOTE: Must have C- or better in CSCI 101B, D, and QMTH 205 as prerequisites for other courses.

Core: ECON 216, ECON 315, ECON 316, and 18 additional hours in ECON courses numbered above 299.

Minor: All students earning a B.A. must select a minor unless obtaining a dual or double degree.

Electives: Take courses to equal Winthrop's graduation requirement of 120 hours. Must take 40 hours above 299.
