Elaine Boyce League graduated from Winthrop in 1966 with a B.S. in physical education. After graduation, she began her career as a middle school teacher in Prince Williams County, Va. She taught in Virginia for six years. During her time in Virginia, she married, and her first child Meredith was born in 1970.

In 1973, her son Christian was born and the family moved to St. Louis, Mo. She and her children left St. Louis for South Carolina in 1978, where she began a 22- year teaching career at Bell Street Middle School. While teaching at Bell, she coached basketball and volleyball. For over 20 years she was an instructor for *Firearm Safety and the Hunter*, which was part of the sixth grade curriculum. There she guided students through the safe use of rifles and shotguns following the Department of Natural Resources curriculum guidelines.
