2019-2020 Reflection on Graduation Rates

When examining and considering graduation rates the metrics of 6-years for undergraduates, 3 years for MATs, and 4 years for advanced programs are used. This represents 1.5 times the number of years planned for each category.

Undergraduate Teacher Certification

The Educator Preparation Program (EPP) examines graduation rates based on the major at admission to the university as well as admission into the teacher education program (typically occurring by close of year two). When considering from point of University admission, rates vary but are trending up with the highest in the report cycle being the more recent cohort (2013 start) which was 44.7% with an eight year average of 37.7%. The EPP believes that some contributing factors for the trend among the most recent cohorts include but are not limited to intentional advising when a student appears to be off course for graduation; attention to support for requirements such as the testing requirement and GPA; and implemented flexibility where possible in the education core sequence as well as methods sequences in the two largest programs. It is also important to note that our rates exceed that of the university when examining comparable numbers. This is quite notable as the graduation requirements related to GPA and external assessments are higher.

When only considering students that are admitted to the teacher education program, the graduation rate increases significantly (92.8% in the most recent cohort) and remains high (92.6% as an eight-cohort average). The rate has seen a trend of being slightly lower in the most recent cohorts. As noted in the CAEP review cycle, the EPP has been examining pass rates on the certification exam (required prior to student teaching) and identified areas where intervention is needed. Although some work has already begun we expect this process to take time to implement fully and longer for the impact to appear in the graduation rates.

Master of Arts in Teaching

There are multiple pathways within this degree that allow for use of accelerated design, programs addressing career changers, and a newly added residency model. Like the eventual graduation rates for undergraduate teacher certification students, we are working to explore further efforts to increase the graduation rates although high. The most recent cohort was 71.0% and the eight-cohort rate was 78.7%.

Advanced Programs

The graduation rate for advanced programs remains high and has been trending higher. The most recent cohort was 100% and the eight-cohort rate was 88.7%. This is typical of graduate programs in general.
