- CVPA Website update was given by Lauren. As a result of the Town Hall with the Provost at the Faculty Assembly in October 2022, a committee formed and met with Assistant Provost Meg Webber to discuss the creation of an eye-catching website for the creative college. Peer institute sites have been used for examples (Anderson, School of Arts, etc.). Following the meeting, Laruen and Kyle Sweeney wrote a proposal. The Provost and President approved it for a beta-test site. Using Square Space to build it, once generated, it will be shown to a controlled audience for review and then, when shared with the President, he will use it to make a more informed decision for final approval.

- <u>The Provost Search Committee</u> has been formed. The representatives, including that of CVPA will be announced by the President shortly.
- Summer Course Incentives Summer Course Incentives The University is looking at \$5,000 compensation (like last year) per course for Full Time Faculty and \$3000 for part time, per course. Course caps are being discussed for summer 2023. Courses could also be virtual, considering many students go home for the summer. Chairs have been asked to work with their faculty to collect ideas for summer offerings based on need and interest. We are being asked to look at incentives for students, for example, taking a suite of courses across the different summer sessions resulting in a minor, or certificate program. To assist with affordability, for students, tuition will not be raised, and there is discussion regarding creating packages, such as 2 courses for the price of 1, for example.
- Thompson Faculty Award the application was sent to faculty by the Provost in November. We have not received any nominations thus far. Please consider applying for this award, which provides 2 course releases to work on a project to advance the department/college/university.

- VII. Student Services + Center for Student Wellness (Amber Slack- Dean of Students and Associate Vice President of Student Affairs; Jackie Concordora- Director of Center for Student Wellness; Ruth Walkup- Health Services Nurse Manager and Nurse Practioner)
  - a. CARE referral process (for medical/mental health/behavioral concerns)
    - When reviewing students in distressed moments, ask: "Is this an academic issue or and student concern issue?" Incident reports' link is on the website (see handout). Submit a CARE alert. The CSW will encourage the student to help themselves and empower them. They do not dictate to the fac/staff about what to do with the student, they just verify the information submitted. If a student is having day to day anxiety attacks, refer them to health services.
  - b. Resources (emergency funds, academic advocate, food shelf, student absences)
    - See resource forms on the DSU website.
  - c. Academic integrity process
    - Process to follow: 1<sup>st</sup> Submit an online alert form, 2<sup>nd</sup> Meet with student, 3<sup>rd</sup> Send official documentation to the Dena of Students Office.
  - d. CSW resources
    - Center for Student Wellness used to be the Health Center. It is there to also aid Fac/ Staff with how to help students. It is funded by semester based fees students pay not by E and G. Students enrolled



full time are covered for care. Counselling Services are provided at 10 sessions per academic year. Walk-ins welcome if a crisis is at hand. Victims support is now Student Advocacy and Trauma Support. It is located on the ground level of Crawford. If you have a student in need, just send them over, don't try to analyze it. Mental health issues are more frequent currently. The trend used to be in depression but now it is anxiety. There are 465 diagnoses presently for enrolled students.

■ How to help — 1<sup>st</sup> remain calm and regulate yourself, 2<sup>nd</sup> control your breathing and remove the student from the room with a close class mate if possible, regain calmness and come back to the class. Students are given information about coping skills, mindfulness, etc. during their therapy at CSW. For Fac/ Staff and for students, if a pattern occurs, seek resources on campus, create a plan for successful outcomes.

#### e. Response protocols for students experiencing medical/ mental health incidents in class

- Mental health incidents, see above in (d).
- Loss of consciousness is caused by seizures, low glucose, head injury, substance abuse, past trauma trigger, fatigue. Signs are unresponsiveness, confusion, dizzy, blurred vision, etc. If this a fainting occurs in the classroom, look for sign of injury or breathing issues; help the student gently to the floor; stay calm; call 911 for help to come; and Campus Security to completed an incident report.

#### f. Q + A

- It was asked "what do students do to get help with CSW?" Response: "To be seen and assisted in the most efficient manner, students need to have an up to date council documentation and recommendations to get accommodation."
- It was requested to report times students faint in classes by completing a CARE report. Fill out the form. In reporting it, this takes care of the student and protects the faculty.
- The CSW can then trace trends in students for more efficient care.
- Timing and slow assistance was expressed as a concern by a faculty member. The process is slowed when students do not give documentation; when students do not respond to emails or communications, or have scheduling conflicts.

# Winthrop Alert Protocol

The Academic Success Center and the Dean of Students office both provide support to vulnerable students and have separate systems for reporting student concerns. The type of alert you should submit depends on the nature of your concern.

Please save and utilize this Alert Protocol to assist you in providing appropriate referrals.

The Dean of Students Office works closely with students who are dealing with personal issues that impact academic performance. Examples of wellness or behavioral concerns include worrisome behaviors, concern for a student's safety, disorderly conduct, etc.

The Academic Success Center assists with connecting academically vulnerable students to campus resources and providing academic coaching to help build skills needed for academic success. Examples of academic concerns include multiple absences (more than 3), consistent missed work, and/or lack of engagement.







## **CSW Services**

  - ❖ Same Day intakes schedule on Portal
    - Students can sign up for a call back on the portal or ask the front desk to put them on the call back column
  - 10 sessions per year (brief solution focused)
  - Crisis appointments walk in or call
  - Send students over who need immediate support (issues re. safety, severe panic attack, recent trauma)
- Student Advocacy and Trauma Support
  - Refer students to Coordinator for resources related to Sexual Assault, IPV, DV, stalking

## **CSW Services cont.**

- Health Services
  - Acute care for sudden onset illness or injury (no treatment for chronic conditions)
    - ❖i.e., flu, COVID, strep, injury to skin, ankle sprain... not head injuries
  - Labs, stitches, OTC meds, physical exams
  - Blue notes document date of visit; not an excuse from class
     DOSO provides absence verifications
- CSW and DOSO coordination for extenuating circumstances

## **Mental Health**

## \*PANIC IS NOT LIFE THREATENING\*

## What you may observe the student to be experiencing:

- Increased heart rate
- Sweatiness
- Shakiness
- Sensations of shortness of breath or smothering
- Feeling of choking
- Chest pain or discomfort
- Nausea or abdominal distress
- Dizzy, lightheaded, or faint
- Numbness or tingling sensation
- Chills or heat sensation

### How you can help:

- Take a deep breath, and be a calm and steady presence – Panic feeds on Panic
- Panic will Pass: breathing room & time
- Allow the student to do what they need to gain space and wait it out (ex: step out in the hall to engage coping skills, return when it passes)
- Privately ask the student what they need should it happen again – odds are good this isn't a new experience. Are they engaged in resources? If this is a pattern, encourage the student to register with Office of Accessibility for accommodations.

## **Loss of Consciousness**

#### **Potential Causes:**

- seizures
- low glucose
- head injury
- drugs/alcohol abuse
- past trauma from abuse

## Signs and Symptoms of Loss of Consciousness:

- Unresponsiveness
- stammering speech
- fast heartbeat
- confusion and lightheadedness

#### First Aid for Loss of Consciousness:

- If you are able, help the student to the ground
- Call 911 for EMS
- Look for visible signs of injury and check for signs of breathing
- Give an update to the EMS personnel upon arrival about what was occurring when the student lost consciousness

#### First Aid for Seizures:

- Refer to digital seizure first aid flier
- Move furniture/items away from student to prevent injury – do NOT restrain them
- Call 911 for EMS and time seizure
- EMS will check the student's vital signs and ensure the student is stable
- They will ask the student if they want to be transferred to the hospital. Sometimes the student will refuse transport. It is their right to refuse further treatment.
- Privately ask the student what they need should it happen again. If this is a pattern, encourage the student to register with Office of Accessibility for accommodations if not already.

#### In Case of Emergency

If there are no intake appointments available, you can still talk to a counselor!

On the Medicat Patient Portal, return to the appointment search and choose "call back from same day counselor" as the appointment type. Or, you can call the front desk and request a call back from a counselor today.

Either way, you'll need to complete some forms on the portal - after you submit those, the counselor will return your call within 90 minutes.

#### **Coming Back to Counseling**

If you've met with a counselor here in the past year, you can schedule an appointment through the front desk (call 803-323-2206) - or e-mail your counselor.

These appointments are "Intake Returns," so you don't have to go through the Same Day Intake process all over again.




### **Ongoing Appointments**

After your first (same-day intake) appointment, you will be able to schedule your follow-up sessions with your ongoing counselor.

All your follow-up appointments will be scheduled ahead of time, so you can find something that works with your schedule.





#### **Counseling for Trauma**

If you've experienced trauma (recent or in the past), and are ready to address it in counseling, you can get connected to a trauma counselor in one of two ways:

- Follow the instructions above to get an intake with general counseling - once here, ask if SATS (Student Advocacy and Trauma Support) counseling would be a good fit.
- Contact the SATS coordinator, Itali Jackson (jacksoni@winthrop.edu), for a consultation and ask to begin counseling. This is a good option if you need other resources (housing, legal, advocacy) beyond counseling.

# step-by-step

### WHAT CAN I SCHEDULE ONLINE?



For new clients, the quickest, easiest way to schedule an appointment is through the portal.

The only appointments you can schedule online are appointments that will happen TODAY.

There are only two types of appointments you can schedule online via the Medicat Patient Portal:


- Intake Appointment (in person or telehealth)
- Call back from the same-day counselor

### **LOGGING IN**


Scheduling online is through the Medicat Patient Portal. Be sure that you are using the FIREFOX or SAFARI browser to ensure compatibility.

Log in using the name and password you set up during your initial use of the portal.

Schedule a new appointment by clicking the "Appts" tab on the header bar. \*


## CHOOSE THE COUNSELING CLINIC

## SEARCH FOR TODAY'S APPOINTMENTS

Your final search should look like the screen to the right, though you might be searching for a different appointment type.

DO choose all providers - our intake/same day counselors rotate, so you won't know who is working that day to search.






### A NOTE ABOUT APPOINTMENT TYPES

- For telehealth appointments, you must physically be in SC at the time of the appointment.
- If requesting a call from a counselor, be sure you complete the paperwork in the patient portal after scheduling and expect a counselor to call within 90 minutes of doing so, regardless of which time you choose.

### PICK AN AVAILABLE APPOINTMENT



After you submit your search, all available appointments of that type will show for today. Changing the date won't show any appointments since all online scheduling is only for today's appointments.

Choose an appointment time that works for you, then complete the necessary forms on your forms

If nothing is showing up for today's date, all the available appointments have been scheduled. You can:

--Schedule a call back from a counselor by returning to the appointment search

# Seizure First Aid

How to help someone having a seizure

1

**STAY** with the person until they are awake and alert after the seizure.

✓ Time the seizure ✓ Remain calm

✓ Check for medical ID



2

Keep the person **SAFE**.

✓ Move or guide away from harm



3

Turn the person onto their **SIDE** if they are not awake and aware.

✓ Keep airway clear

- ✓ Loosen tight clothes around neck
- ✓ Put something small and soft under the head



Call **911** if...

- Seizure lasts longer than 5 minutes
- Person does not return to their usual state
- Person is injured, pregnant, or sick
- Repeated seizures
- First time seizure
- Difficulty breathing
- Seizure occurs in water

Do **NOT** 

- X Do **NOT** restrain.
- X Do **NOT** put any objects in their mouth.
  - ✓ Rescue medicines can be given if prescribed by a health care professional
