These portfolios further the historical purpose of printmaking, to disseminate information to the masses. All participating artists agree to an edition size and to produce identical artworks to reach that number, each utilizing agreed upon traditional or experimental print techniques (screenprint, etching, digital, lithography, woodblock, etc). Works are then exchanged among participants, each artist receiving multiple new prints for their personal collections. Many of these works are in permanent collections and contain prominent names within the contemporary art community. This exhibition highlights diverse portfolios featuring global artists, and previous and current @PrintmakingWinthrop students.




