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DIRECTOR'S NOTE

RENT

"What makes *Rent* so wonderful is not its hipness quotient, but its extraordinary spirit of hopeful defiance and humanity."

– The New York Times

I saw this show in the early 90's when I was teaching high school - all my students were taking the bus to NYC from Boston to get student rush tickets to see the latest Broadway cast – they were RENTheads. Many musical theatre aficionados have written so much about this show; its' problems, how it's unfinished, how brilliant it is, the nods to Sondheim, etc. I won't try to reiterate, however, *RENT* is still relevant today. My own children are facing the challenge of "adulthood" in three cities on the east coast, working multiple jobs, finding their way, paying their rent and changing the world they inherited to make it better as did Jonathan Larson's characters in *RENT*.

We just experienced a global pandemic (which is not over) and millions of people died. People were so isolated, in pain and suffered great losses. HIV and AIDS were equally devastating to a generation of the Queer community in the 90's and hatred, bigotry, antisemitism, racism, sexism, homophobia, transphobia, etc. are rampant still today. How sad that almost thirty years since *RENT* opened on Broadway we still are fighting HATE, and people of all communities are struggling to be treated as equals, to be seen, to have rights over their lives, their bodies, and who and how they love. We still experience too much hate in the world even as I type this.

"Five hundred twenty-five thousand six hundred minutes" ...as the song *Seasons of Love* tells us. For us: eighteen performers, two hundred seventy-seven costume pieces, one hundred thirty lighting instruments, three hundred twenty-three lighting cues, eighty-seven sound cues, one hundred sixty hours to create the costumes, one hundred sixty hours to build the set, one hundred fifty-nine hours of rehearsals, fifteen stools, three tables, one couch, etc. How much does it take to create a theatrical production of a musical and make it happen? So many people and so many minutes. How do you measure? "In daylight, in sunsets, in midnights in cups of coffee, in inches, in miles, in laughter, in strife" – Jonathan Larsen's method of measuring a year was and still is brilliant. *RENT* is about people finding their way and living and loving for today, one minute at a time.

Thank you to the cast and crew, to Ramona Kundl, to the stage management team, to all the amazing designers, to Jeff McEvoy and Zinorl Broñola for all their work with music and vocals for this production, and to Kelly Ozust, my partner in all of this and an amazing choreographer and colleague. Thanks to my family for their support and to JH for everything else. If you take only one thing away after spending one hundred thirty-five minutes here today, be grateful for what you have and who you have to love and keep fighting for others, and remember to live life to the fullest with love and gratitude – NO DAY BUT TODAY.
