

Dear Colleagues,

January 28th is the anniversary of the Challenger explosion that killed Dr. Ronald E. McNair and his fellow astronauts. This week, you may see folks on campus wearing blue ribbons or "Ask Me About My Ribbon" stickers as one of the ways we are remembering the sacrifices and legacy of Dr. McNair and his family. Dr. McNair's legacy includes, but is not limited to, the 187 TRiO McNair programs around the country that are specifically funded by the U.S. Department of Education to "prepare eligible participants for doctoral studies through involvement in research and other scholarly activities (https://www2.ed.gov/programs/triomcnair/index.html)."

Winthrop's McNair program is 10 years old and is funded to serve 30 new or continuing participants from SC institutions each year. Students can come from any major. Two-thirds of each cohort must meet both the first generation and low-income criteria. Up to the remaining 1/3rd are eligible because they come from an underrepresented racial or ethnic group.

So far, we have served 143 outstanding students. All of our students have completed high quality research with expert faculty mentors. That experience has opened doors for them and resulted in impressive outcomes for our program. Already this year, our stellar seniors have received an impressive number of interview offers. A few of the long list of schools our students have received graduate admissions offers are: Duke, the Dental College of Georgia, Boston College, Ohio State, and Johns Hopkins.

We have 124 alumni with bachelor's degrees. The 110 McNair alumni who graduated over a year ago have earned 53 Master's Degrees, 5 Specialist Degrees, and 10 Doctorates (see table below). Our program could not be so successful without the dedication of faculty mentors, support of the administration (especially President Mahony and Dean Jones), and work of McNair staff & the Advisory Board. We continue to owe huge debts of gratitude to

the folks in Grants, Financial Aid, Records and Registration, Student Services, Campus Housing, Printing Services, Accounts Payable, The Foundation & Alumni Relations, ONCA, Undergraduate Research, Eagle STEM, Honors, ASC, and so many others throughout University College and the institution.
