Dear Colleagues,

January 28, 2021 is the 35th anniversary of the Challenger explosion that killed Dr. Ronald E. McNair and his fellow astronauts. This week, we reflect on the sacrifices and legacy of Dr. McNair and his family. This legacy includes, but is not limited to, the 187 TRiO McNair programs around the country funded by the U.S. Department of Education "to increase the attainment of Ph.D. degrees by students from underrepresented segments of society" "through involvement in [undergraduate] research and other scholarly activities" (<u>https://www2.ed.gov/programs/triomcnair/index.html</u>).

Winthrop's McNair program was founded in 2009 and is funded to serve 30 new and continuing participants each year. Students can come from any undergraduate degree program at Winthrop and other SC institutions. Two-thirds of each cohort must be first generation college students from low-income families. The majority of Winthrop's Scholars come from racial and ethnic groups underrepresented in graduate education.

So far, we have served 162 outstanding students. All of our students have completed high quality research with expert faculty mentors. That experience has opened doors for them and resulted in impressive outcomes for our program. Almost all of our 2020-21 seniors have applied to graduate programs in the past few months. Offers for interviews, master's programs, and at least one PhD program are rolling in.

Of the 142 Winthrop McNair alumni not currently enrolled in undergraduate degree programs, 138 (97%) earned at least one bachelor's degree. Alumni who graduated over a year ago have earned 63 Master's Degrees, 5 Specialist Degrees, and 13 Doctorates (see below). The expertise and investment of faculty mentors, work of the <u>Advisory Board</u>, dedication of the McNair staff, and support of the administration make this possible. We continue to owe huge debts of gratitude to the folks in Grants, Financial Aid, Records and Registration, Student Services, Campus Housing, Printing Services, Accounts Payable, The Foundation & Alumni Relations, ONCA, Undergraduate Research, Eagle STEM, Honors, ASC, and so many others throughout University College and the institution.
