Exs. of Financial, Academic, & Social Obstacles that Impact Eligible Students

Lack of models, confidence, what to expect, perceived support, physical and mental wellness, and finances

The cost of an advanced degree (68%) is the top reason that might prevent undergraduate students likely to pursue an advanced degree from pursuing one; however, cost is an especially significant barrier for black and Hispanic and first-generation college students. Three-quarters of black (77%) and Hispanic (75%) students, versus 58% of Asian and 68% of white students, cite high cost as one of the top factors discouraging them from attending graduate or professional school. ⁷ (Newsome, 2021)

"Indeed, even if the economic obstacles are overcome, low-SES students may still experience more threat, more health problems, more negative emotions, and lower levels of motivation than their high-SES counterparts. Such "self-debilitating" motivations and behaviors (Sidanius & Pratto, 1999) may in turn produce and maintain the SES achievement gap, resulting in a vicious cycle. (Jury, et al., 2017; p. 27)"⁹

Required & Permissible Project Services

(a) **Opportunities for research or other scholarly activities**

at the grantee institution or at graduate centers that are designed to provide participants with effective preparation for doctoral study

(b) Summer internships (stipend, room and board)

(c) Seminars and other educational activities

designed to prepare participants for doctoral study

(d) Tutoring

(e) Academic counseling

(f) Admissions and Financial Aid Assistance

Assistance to participants in securing admission to and financial assistance for enrollment in graduate programs; also financial literacy

(g) Mentoring

programs involving faculty members or students at institutions of higher education, or any combination of faculty members and students

(h) Exposure to cultural events and academic programs

not usually available to project participants (ICRM, GA) (Authority: 20 U.S.C. 1070a–15)

Mentor Responsibilities

- Participate in orientation
- Provide graduate-style mentoring
- Respond to the Scholar's requests by the end of the next business day
- Share insight and recommend resources for graduate study
- Provide feedback during & after SRE (online eval)
- Meet in-person at least 15 hours
 - Spring & remote live meetings (e.g., via Zoom, phone) count
- You can meet in groups as appropriate
- Meet to facilitate the progress of the research project from planning to presentation
- Inform the Director immediately if you have concerns about the Scholar's performance, progress, or ability to complete program responsibilities

Mentor Responsibilities (Cont.)

- Mentoring logs MUST be submitted by <u>July 12th</u>
- Abide by the policies in the Faculty Manual
- After the SRE, follow up
- Provide your signature to indicate you understand and accept the responsibilities of being a McNair Mentor



Mentoring Outcomes

Required: Research

- Student research or scholarly product
- Presentation of at least preliminary findings by 7/30
- Share your wisdom about "doing" scholarship
 - IRB/IACUC
 - Lit review
 - Sampling, Reducing error
 - Preparing presentations
 - Submitting for external review

Plus: Grad School Advice

- Suggest outlets for presentation
 & publication
- Share about Grad Admissions
 - Preparing a good statement
 - ► GRE, Applying, Interviewing
- Share lessons you learned earning your doctorate
 - Comps, choosing your committee, writing your dissertation
- Suggest graduate programs
 - We've got guides
- Suggest grad school funding
- Facilitate networking


