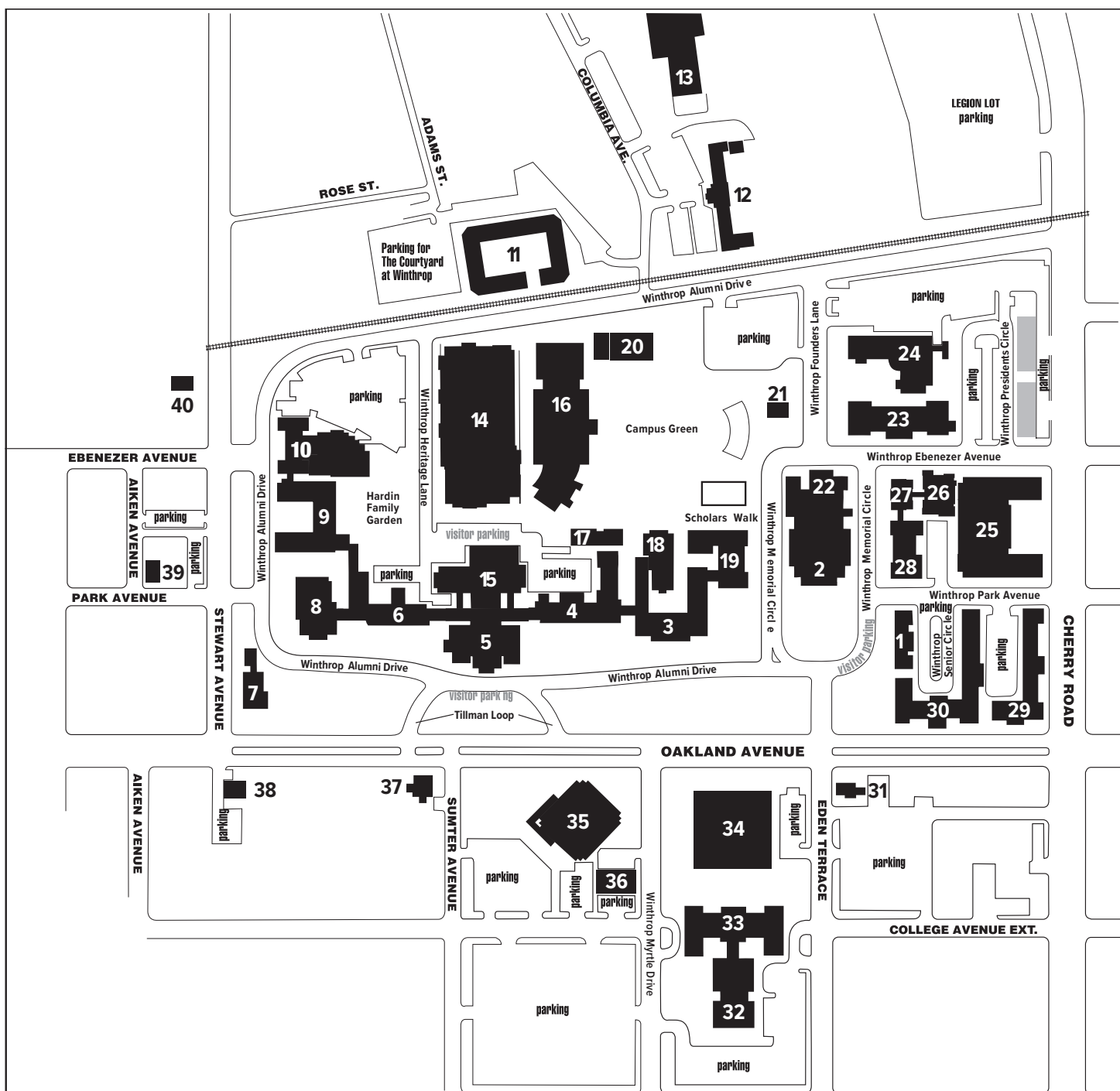

# STUDENT RIGHTS AND RECORDS

## FERPA



Winthrop recognizes that the role of the parent and/or family member does not end once the student begins college. Many parents and family members want to find out their student's grades, ask about their student's performance, or check on their student's finances. However, access to all of these is protected under the federal Family Educational Rights & Privacy Act (FERPA), which states that once a student turns 18 or enters a postsecondary institution at any age, the university cannot release information about the student to anyone – even parents or other family members.



Once students are enrolled, regardless of age, parents or guardians will not have access to their educational information unless your student specifically grants it to you. It's worth reading more about FERPA and then discussing the types of protected information and how your student will share information with you. You can also request that your student set you up as an Authorized User through Wingspan (see below), which will give you more access.

## Authorized Users of Student Records

**Who is an Authorized User?** Any person that a student has authorized to have access to view their student account and/or make payments online on their behalf.

**What information can be accessed by an Authorized User?** Students have the option to allow their Authorized User access to view the entire account activity and balance, or allow them "payment only" access through the payment gateway. Student grades and other academic records are not included.

**I pay the bill. Why can't I call to discuss my student's Winthrop records?** For students 18 and under and not enrolled in a postsecondary institution, the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) is a federal law that gives parents the right to have access to their children's educational records, the right to have the records amended and the right to have some control over the disclosure of personally identifiable information from the educational records. However, when a student turns 18 years old or enters a postsecondary institution at any age, the rights under FERPA transfers from the parent to the student.

This means that any record, be it academic, financial or judicial, will not be released to anyone other than the student. This includes Orientation events, like Academic Advising and Course Registration.

For financial accounts, students are able to give prior written permission or Authorized User access granted from the student (completed through the Account Summary and Payment Gateway). When a student makes someone an Authorized User, they are allowing them limited access to their financial student account and/or to make payments on their behalf. More information about FERPA can be found above.

**Can my student give me permission to discuss their Winthrop records?** Students who wish to give permission to a third party to discuss their student account may do so by filling out the Permission to Release Student Records form found on the Records and Registration website. By filling out this form, students can determine which aspects of their educational record can be released to a third party as well as determine who those parties may be. Students do NOT have to submit this form for a parent or third party to be an authorized user for payment purposes as instructed above. Students may also give grade access through the Parent Proxy Portal. For more information, visit <https://www.winthrop.edu/recandreg/parent-proxy.aspx>.

## Info to Know

### Registration Holds

Having a registration hold on your account will prevent you from registering for upcoming semesters.

- These are typically applied following the last day to Withdraw or S/U.
- Your balance must be below \$1,000 to register for courses

### Fee Payment Deadline

Deadline dates vary, access the Billing Schedule on the SFS Webpage under Payment Deadlines. Students must do one of the following by the Fee Payment Deadline in order to protect their course schedule from being dropped:

- Tuition & Fees covered in full by Financial Aid and/or Outside Loans
- Tuition & Fees paid in full
- Enroll in a Payment Plan and make the first payment

## Frequently Asked Questions

- Q** How do students view their Winthrop e-bill?
- A** E-Bills are e-mailed to the student's Winthrop e-mail address according to the billing schedule located on the SFS webpage. Students may also view their current charges, payments, any anticipated Financial Aid, download Statements, and enroll in Payment Plans by logging into Wingspan then clicking Account Summary and Payments (to the upper left). Students should direct questions to SFS.
- Q** What happens if payments are not made or arranged by the Fee Payment Deadline?
- A** A late fee may be imposed and, if not paid, the student's course schedule will ultimately be dropped. Students will then have to re-register for classes and pay their fees. However, Winthrop cannot guarantee that students will be able to re-register for the same courses they were previously enrolled in.
- Q** What if I have a balance at the end of the term?
- A** Registration & Transcript holds are applied to student accounts following the last day to Withdraw or S/U from courses. Your balance must be below \$1,000 to register for the next semester, and \$0 to acquire transcripts.
- Q** How do I make a payment?
- A** Pay online through Account Summary & Payments on Wingspan or the SFS Cashiers Window (22 Tillman Hall). SFS does NOT accept credit card payments at the payment window, by mail, or telephone.

- Entrance Counseling:** Complete to retain your awarded Financial Aid.
- Financial Aid Awards:** Review these in Wingspan and Accept/Decline Awards..
- Direct Deposit:** Enroll via Wingspan for fast & convenient refunds (instructions on SFS page)
- Authorized User(s):** Designate persons in the Payment Gateway (see pg 4)
- Family Education Rights & Privacy Act (FERPA) Form:** Fill out to permit release of information with specified family/guardian(s) (see pg 4)
- Deadlines:** Be aware of add/drop dates for tuition & fee adjustments.
- Payment Plan:** Enroll to spread out payments and protect your schedule.
- Student Account Balance:** Resolve balance before the fee payment deadline to avoid registration holds & dropped schedule.
- Tuition Insurance:** Consider insurance to help refund tuition in case a student cannot complete classes due to extenuating circumstances.
- VA or Other 3rd Party Paperwork:** Turn in paperwork at least one week before the Fee Payment Deadline.
- Winthrop Email:** Check regularly for University notices!

## The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

Students should complete the FAFSA every year. FAFSA determines a student’s eligibility for financial aid. Winthrop’s school code is 003456.



## What Should I Know About Financial Aid?

The Office of Financial Aid will only contact your student regarding their aid (rather than parents or guardians).

Communication from the Office of Financial Aid will only be via your student’s Winthrop e-mail account or via Wingspan.

Financial disbursement for the regular academic year begins approximately one week prior to the first day of fall and spring classes.

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# MEETING WITH YOUR ACADEMIC COLLEGE

A university is a collection of academic colleges and schools.  
Here is a breakdown of Winthrop's Academic Colleges:



## Things to Know:

- ✓ 12-18 credit hours is considered a full-time student.
- ✓ Most students choose to take 15-17 credit hours in their first semester (about 5-6 classes).
- ✓ You can make changes to your schedule through the first week of classes. Make sure to talk to your advisor about significant changes!
- ✓ All new freshmen students must take ACAD 101 in their first semester.
- ✓ AP/IB/Dual Enrollment Credit: If your credit hasn't arrived yet, be sure you've requested to have your scores/transcripts sent to Winthrop. Once your credit comes in, you can talk to your advisor about any changes to your schedule.
- ✓ You can get anywhere on campus in 10-15 minutes, so don't worry about having back-to-back classes.
- ✓ A prerequisite is a course required to take another course. You will not be able to take a class that requires a prerequisite without taking the prerequisite first.

## Winthrop's General Education Core

These are courses most freshman Winthrop students will complete.

### Academy (ACAD) 101

- Principles of the Learning Academy
- Required for all freshmen
- Introduces students to concepts, resources, and skills necessary for success at Winthrop

### Writing (WRIT) 101

- Required writing composition course
- Introduces students to college-level, thesis-driven, research-based writing
- Planning, organizing, and developing persuasive essays

### The Human Experience (HMXP) 102

- Academic engagement and intellectual challenge through written and oral responses
- Interdisciplinary readings
- Explore the "self"

### Critical Reading, Thinking & Writing (CRTW) 201

- Examine the language of critical thinking and argumentation
- Gain the skill of thinking about your thinking

## Academic Lingo

### Credit Hour

A credit hour is an amount of work represented in intended learning outcomes and verified evidence of student achievement. All courses are measured by the number of credit hours you earn upon completion of that course. Your degree program requires a certain number of credit hours to be completed.

### Course Schedule

Your course schedule is the set time that you are in classes during a particular semester. The course schedule varies per semester, as you register for one semester at a time.

### Academic Advisor

Your academic advisor is a professional representative in your academic college who you will meet with each semester to plan for the next semester in order to stay on track toward earning your degree.

In high school and for your first semester at Winthrop, some classes may be chosen for you. For your second semester at Winthrop and beyond, your advisor will provide guidance and you will register yourself for classes and choose your schedule to an extent. ***While your academic advisor will be helpful, you are responsible for keeping yourself on track toward your degree.***

The CDI provides resources and programs for students and alumni to develop the career readiness skills needed to make informed decisions and conduct effective career planning (internships, jobs, continuing education). ### Math Tutorial Center

#### **Bancroft 271**

The MTC is open to all students enrolled in a math course at WU. Students should bring their textbook, notes, and calculator, and be prepared to ask questions. No appointment needed – open regularly throughout the academic year.

### Writing Center

#### **Bancroft 242**

The Writing Center provides free writing consultation and helps writers at all levels learn more about their writing through tutoring sessions. Students must make an appointment through the online scheduling system.

### Chemistry Tutoring Lab

#### **Sims 301**

The Chemistry Tutorial Lab is open to all students enrolled in a chemistry course at WU. No appointment needed – open regularly throughout the academic year.

### College of Business Resource Room

#### **Thurmond 303**

The Resource Room is open to students in the College of Business. Tutors are available for assistance with select courses, including Computer Science (CSCI). No appointment needed – open regularly throughout the academic year.

### Language Learning Center

#### **Kinard 307**

The LLC (or Language Lab) is open to students enrolled in a foreign language course at WU. Staff are available for homework help during regular semester hours – no appointment needed.

### Dacus Library

Dacus supports the instructional and research activities of WU and provides students with study spaces. The library staff are a helpful resource for students.

### Faculty Office Hours

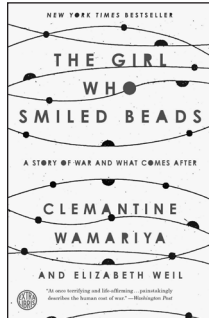
All faculty are required to hold office hours for students to drop by with questions or concerns. These hours are listed in each syllabus based on the instructor.

## Immunization Compliance

Complete your immunization compliance in the Patient Portal by July 15, 2024. Residential students will not be able to sign up for a move-in time unless they are fully compliant. Paper forms will not be accepted. All in-person students must fully satisfy immunization requirements. Failure to comply will result in a non-refundable \$100 non-compliance fee and registration hold on their student account. 4. When does this social event begin and when does it end?
5. Why are you going? Be honest with yourself and prepared.
6. How will you get there and how will you get home?

Free condoms are available next to the elevator on the third floor of Joynes. If you are going to engage in sexual activity, use protection and do so responsibly. Being responsible also means obtaining active consent. No consent, no sex.

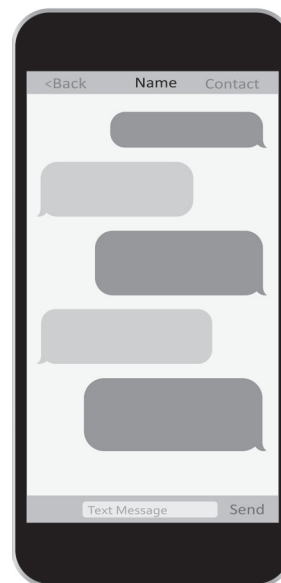

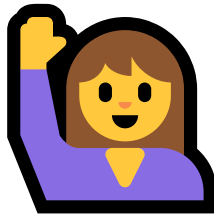

## The Office of Accessibility

The Office of Accessibility (OA) works to ensure that students with disabilities have an equal opportunity to participate fully in their educational experience by facilitating accommodations, discourse, and engagement. OA aims to empower Winthrop students toward self-advocacy, independence, and personal responsibility while providing disability-related education and guidance to the Winthrop community.

What is a disability? The Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA) defines a disability as a mental or physical impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities. Some examples of disabilities include, but are not limited to: ADHD/ADD, blindness or low vision, chronic medical illness, deafness or hard of hearing, learning disabilities, mental health conditions and mobility concerns.

Students must self-identify with OA in order to request disability related accommodations with these three steps.

# Police Department
