I. **Approval of minutes** of the November 10, 2023 meeting (approved via email)

II. **Remarks from the Chair** (Michael Whitney)

Dr. Whitney spoke about including the Director of Gen Ed as a non-voting member. This has been talked about previously and we support. This request is at the Rules Committee and will be presented at the next Faculty Conference to be voted on later.

Dr. Whitney also mentioned the Gen Ed review task force/working group. He worked with Dr. Judge before he left and it is in beginning stages. We now have a new Provost so this is on pause until he gets up to speed.

III. **Remarks from the Provost and Executive Vice President for Academic Affairs** (Tim Drueke, Assistant Provost, standing in)

Mr. Drueke thanked everyone on behalf of the Provost for all their work. Regarding the Gen Ed task force, he pointed out that in the WU magazine there was an introduction to the strategic plan. He encouraged everyone to take a look at this. There are several things AC will be involved with in terms of goals and objectives. The leadership team in the Provost's office will be working on metrics.

He also stated that they are continuing to work on Competency-Based Education (CBE). The Provost's Office appreciates the Council's work on all the program changes.

IV. Remarks from the Council of Student Leaders (CSL) Representative

Victoria Williams, Chair of the Campus Committee, attended today and introduced herself. She did not have anything to bring to the Council but said if anyone had questions, to let them know.

V. Reports from Standing Committees

All programs passed unanimously.

The Chair of the Computing and Information Sciences department requested from Dr. Abernathy a discussion for BIOL 383-384 due to overlap with CSCI labs as well as VCOM courses that may overlap with programming courses.

Dr. Abernathy asked if we should let the departments talk and then review again next time. Dr. Matthews said that would be a good idea. There were no objections to tabling.

[Update: the respective departments convened and agreed that all six courses should proceed to the next stage. Since no voting from AC is required and discussions have concluded, they will be presented to Faculty Conference on February 23, 2024].

Mr. Tselentis asked how this would affect moving the BDes program through the curriculum cycle. Mr. Drueke said as long as it was resolved in the next cycle that would be fine. Mr. Tselentis asked what the timeline was, and Mr. Drueke replied that the next CUC meeting was the end of March. Mr. Tselentis clarified this was on hold, and the reply was yes.

[Update: Due to an accreditation deadline of March, Mr. Tselentis worked with CUC members to address all concerns. CUC voted electronically to approve on February 20. AC members voted electronically to approve on February 22, and Chair Whitney presented to Faculty Conference on February 23, 2024].

There was no further discussion on curriculum.

B. General Education Curriculum Committee (Kelly Costner)

Dr. Costner said that he and Dr. Richardson looked at applications in advance and asked for clarifications and gave feedback.

Both courses were approved.

Dr. Richardson talked about cleaning up processes and said to let her or Dr. Costner know of any feedback as they want it to be good for faculty.

VI. **Old Business**

A. ***Review/Approve discontinuing BA 36-hour rule (Proposal from Arts and Sciences) – Appendix C***

Dr. Abernathy took this to the College of Arts and Sciences after the last AC meeting. The Dean's Council unanimously supported this. It was also brought to ASC Faculty Assembly and the majority were in favor. The rule was intended for BAs not to get too bloated, but they said with our Gen Ed program, this was not so much a problem. Dr. Sickels said one dissent had to do with our being a Liberal Arts college.

Dr. Whitney asked if there was a discussion about programs not requiring more than 36 hours but students could take more if they wanted.

Dr. Costner asked what "bloated" meant. Dr. Abernathy said they were worried BA programs having too many courses in the major.

Mr. Drueke said that over the years, there would be students who had 40-50 hours in a course subject designator, so they couldn't apply the hours to their degree. He suggested that we could make it a limit on the curriculum development side. This would certainly simplify a lot of things for the student but would not limit a student in their electives.

Dr. Costner clarified that this came up as student choice but it has led to a curriculum discussion.

Dr. Whitney mentioned some departments that have split up their designators are on a different playing field than others.

Dr. Costner made a suggestion that we remove the rule for students but develop a rule for curriculum development.

Motion passed with one dissent.

The Registrar then asked on behalf of the GRADE Group that this be retroactive to the spring semester.

There was a motion to do so and it passed.

VII. **New Business**

A. ***Intellectual Property Policy (From CBE Policy Review Committee) – Appendix D***

Mr. Drueke asked for any feedback on this updated policy. He said that it still needs to be reviewed by Academic Leadership. Dr. DeRochi added that it is applicable to any online asynchronous course. There was some conversation about talking with legal counsel about shared rights.

Dr. Costner asked where the definition of “blueprint” came from. Mr. Drueke responded that Dr. Kimarie Whetstone (Director of Online Learning) provided the draft language based on reviewing other institutions’ definitions.

B. Review/approve Grading for Competency Based Education (from Registrar and CBE Implementation Committee) – Appendix E

Ms. Jones went over the grading policy. Dr. Whitney asked about Cs and Ds. Dr. DeRochi responded that students must have mastery and this is more rigorous. He explained that typically what you see in these programs is that if they get multiple FXs, they’re going to be encouraged to change programs.

Dr. Matthews said CBE is not new, especially in healthcare where you want nursing students to pass all their competencies.

Dr. Bloomquist requested a language change for “mastery”. Dr. DeRochi replied that this has a different connotation.

Dr. Derochi asked if we can we use “pass with distinction.” Mr. Drueke said that “Pass” has already been used. Dr. Derochi said we can continue to research. He did mention that other faculty has looked at this and were supportive.

Dr. Wonderlich said “competence” has its own connotation. If she says a singer is competent, that’s not a compliment.

Dr. Costner asked about the retaking of assessments. It was clarified that they could take it three times total.

Dr. Whitney suggested we vote with a contingency of researching further language.

Motion passed.

C. Repeating a course-request for change (Discussion from Registrar) – Appendix F

Ms. Jones went over the policy change.

Dr. Whitney gave a scenario about someone retaking an elective to help their GPA at graduation. Ms. Jones remarked that by that time, an SU would hardly make a dent in the GPA.

Dr. Costner clarified about the grades still being visible on the transcript. Ms. Jones acknowledged that this was correct.

This motion was approved unanimously.

D. Additional items

Mr. Drueke talked about an approval process being needed for micro-credentials. Currently, it’s the same for regular programs. This is a long process. When he was at a conference, he learned that other colleges have a shortened approval process. His initial thought was to make a request to the Rules Committee but he would like feedback on this. He asked if it threw up any red flags.

These micro-credentials may end at CUC or at the college.

Dr. Whitney leaned toward having CUC review.

Mr. Druke then congratulated Dr. Woodfill on his "Expeditions Unknown" episode. He said the Cultural Event in Dina's place was packed.

VIII. **Adjournment**

Dr. Whitney adjourned the meeting at 3:07 PM.
