Report of the Associate VP for Graduate Studies: Dr. Wilhelmina Rembert

- 1. <u>Announcement from CHE</u>: Annual stipend of \$1000 available for teachers to return to graduate school. Applications should be sent directly to CHE (see the website). Awards will be made at the end of the academic year.
- 2. Report from the meeting of the South Carolina Graduate Deans
 - Competitive Institute of South Carolina which promotes economic develop is looking at the economic impact of higher education. Discussion concerned the extent to which business and industry may mutually benefit from a partnership with higher education for building intellectual capitol in SC. For example: the STAR-WARS initiative is one way the military/defense partnering with institutions in Charleston (Dr. Rembert will obtain more information regarding the Institute. John Warner spoke to Deans; discussed possibility of a summit to include Deans and Presidents of all four-year. She asks that we think about possibilities.
 - Additional issue discussed: Two year institutes to offer 4-yr degreed still out there: Grad Deans do not support
 - Other graduate programs that are certificate programs being developed.
 offerings include:
 - Citadel: Certification in ESOL
 - College of Charleston & Citadel: MS in Computer Science
 - College of Charleston: Certification in Organizational and Corporate Communication; also a certificate in Statistics
 - U of Carolina: state has appropriated \$465,000 for a MS in Electrical Engineering
 - Low Country Graduate Center in Charleston (like Greenville Center) offers joint programs in graduate degrees from USC.
 - o Doctorate in Education
 - Doctorates in Policy (in areas of Health Care, Transportation, and Environmental Studies)
 - o Doctorate in Computer Science
 - These may or may not have implications for Winthrop University.
- Announced that next meeting of Graduate Assembly will be November 19th in Plowden Auditorium.
- As there was no additional continuing business and no new business, the meeting was adjourned
