

## Adaptive Release Quick Reference Guide

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### Overview

When you create basic or advanced Adaptive Release Rules, you can specify four types of criteria. Use this quick reference guide to select the criteria you want to add to your activity.

Criteria	Description	Examples
<b>Date</b>	<p>Use date criteria to keep learners focused.</p> <p>You can control when content is released rather than releasing all course content at the beginning of the term.</p> <p>You can display content after a specific date, until a specific date, or within a time frame.</p>	<p><i>Example 1:</i> Release modules on specified dates.</p> <p><i>Example 2:</i> Release an exam during a set window of days.</p>
<b>Membership</b>	<p>Use membership criteria to release content to specific learners and course groups.</p>	<p><i>Example 1:</i> Add a make-up assignment for just one learner.</p> <p><i>Example 2:</i> Each group in your course is assigned a different project topic. Release resources to a specific group based on their topic.</p>
<b>Grade</b>	<p>Use grade criteria to release content based on item attempt, item score, or a calculated column.</p>	<p><i>Example 1:</i> Prepare a pre-test for learners to attempt before the post-test is released.</p> <p><i>Example 2:</i> Release an extra credit item to students who scored between 60 and 80. Then, release a practice activity for students who score below 60.</p>
<b>Review Status</b>	<p>Use review status criteria to release content based on a student's review of a specific content item.</p>	<p><i>Example 1:</i> Release Quiz 1 after learners have marked the Academic Integrity Statement as reviewed.</p> <p><i>Example 2:</i> Release Module 2 after learners have marked the Module 1 Summary as reviewed.</p>
