### **2019-20 MILESTONES & ACCOMPLISHMENTS**

- CCIC hosted a Pet Food Drive in December. They collected over 100lbs. of food and volunteers were featured on CN2.
- Over 65 staff attended the annual Ice Cream Social after our October Staff Conference meeting.
- Staff Conference partnered with the Campus Safety

   Committee to offer Active Aggressor Training to
   staff during Campus Safety Week.
- As a result of staff interest in helping actively recruit students to the university, Staff Assembly worked with University Marketing & Communications and Admissions to produce and distribute "Uniquely Winthrop" accordion cards with many answers to the question, "Why should students choose Winthrop?"
- Jackie Concodora was selected to serve as the University Ombudsman.
- Our **Annual Holiday Party** took a trip around the world this year with an international theme and

lots of yummy cookies! Attendance was higher this year by about 15 staff.

- In March, Winthrop said goodbye to President Mahony and welcomed Interim President George Hynd.
- In March, Staff Conference **moved to an online format** to safely share information and keep staff engaged despite COVID-19 restrictions.
- In June, Staff Conference featured a video conversation with Interim President Hynd to address staff concerns about the COVID-19 response.
- The Annual Kick-Off Social was unfortunately cancelled due to COVID-19, but instead Staff Conference hosted a Virtual Drop-In Social via Zoom. Over 40 staff attended.
- Staff Conference addressed **32** staff questions this year!

  - $\circ~$  Featured around **180** staff members.

- Grew the Facebook group to **102** members, up from 82 at the close of 2018-2019. More staff working from home is a major contributor to this growth.
- Currently **474** staff members subscribe to the Staff Stuff monthly mailing list. This number is down from 516 after removing staff members who no longer work at Winthrop. Requests for subscription instructions has significantly increased this year.
