MIXED PAPER

Office and copy paper

(Staples do not have to be removed. Remove and reuse paper and binder clips.)



Books, newspapers and magazines

Phone books and junk mail Sticky notes

> Chipboard shoe, cereal boxes, tissue boxes, etc.



PLASTIC AND METAL

Plastic bottles, jugs and jars





Beverage cans, steel food cans and, clean aluminum foil



OTHER RECYCLABLES

Corrugated cardboard

Flatten and place in designated dumpsters. Remove all plastic and foam.

> Electronics, batteries, ink and toner cartridges

> All are collected in select locations.

All consumer and small personal electronics are banned from South Carolina landfills and must be collected for recycling.

Contact the Office of Sustainability to learn how to properly dispose of these or other unusual materials.

BASICS

- √Re-think how choices & purchases are made & consider impacts to human & natural systems.
- ✓Refuse to use or purchase items that are not useful both in the short & long term - think durable.
- ✓ Reduce the number of items purchased - avoid impulse buys.
- √Reuse items that are still in good condition or share them with other departments, such as three-ring binders.
- ✓ Recycle only after all other options

MIXED OFFICE PAPER NEWSPAPER & MAGAZINES No Corrugated Cardboard





Plastic Beverage Bottles

Aluminum Cans



Plastic Jugs



Plastic Jars (with no food residue)

TRASH

Steel Cans (with no food residue)

GLASS





Chipboard (thick paper used for packaging)

Mixed Paper (newspaper, magazines, inserts, etc.)







Cardboard (place in cardboard dumpster)

(copy paper, folders, etc.)

Only place the items listed above in recycling bins. Use plastic bags for shredded paper. Use paper bags for all other collection.













The triangular symbol on items only indicates the type of plastic or resin the items are made from.

This symbol is not a recycling symbol. Only place the items listed above in recycling bins.




















Ink and Toner Cartridges

Contact the Office of Sustainability for details about recycling all ink and toner cartridges.



Corrugated Cardboard

Flatten all cardboard and place in cardboard dumpster located outside buildings.

Do not place other recyclables or trash into cardboard dumpsters.

Re-purpose Office Supplies

Using the swap-n-shop email, share your unused office supples with other departments. In addition, large recycling bins can be requested when cleaning out offices. Contact the Office of Sustainability for additional details.



Electronics

Contact Computing and Information Technology or the Office of Sustainability for details about recycling all electronics.

NOTE: Personal electronics cannot be recycled on campus. York County residents may take personal electronics to one of York County's 16 Collection and Recycling Centers.



Miscellaneous E-waste

Contact the Office of Sustainability for details about recycling all miscellaneous E-waste.

Plastic Bags and Films

Only recycle clean and dry plastic bags and films at local participating grocery or retail locations. [Plastic bags and films include produce bags; newspaper bags; bread bags; zip-lock bags (with the hard plastic parts removed); dry cleaning bags; packaging for napkins, paper towels and toilet paper; plastic liner from cereal boxes; and case wrap with your grocery bags]



Glass Bottles






