#### Facilities Work Orders – Helpful Tips


- Higher urgency? <u>Include prompts</u> and even <u>tentative deadlines</u> in the work order.

- Only put in work orders once.
- If you need a status update on your work order,



#### COMPETENCY-BASED EDUCATION DEFINED

- A model for higher education, ideal for adult and professional students returning to college
- Focus on learner mastery of knowledge, skills, abilities, attitudes and behaviors (competencies)
- Competencies stack into micro-credentials, certificates, degrees
- Credit for prior learning (PLA)
- Time is variable, learning is fixed
- Flexible, pre-planned, backwards designed curricular journey
- Performance-based, criterion-referenced and authentic assessments
- Personalized approach to wrap-around supports



Competency-based education is a method of academic instruction and evaluation based upon students demonstrating mastery of a subject via performance on relevant, high fidelity, real-world assessments. Deemphasizes time in seat for demonstration of proficiency.

# PURPOSE OF COMPETENCY BASED EDUCATION


To convey a learner's capabilities more clearly and explicitly to employers, while empowering students to engage in a more personalized learning experience, at an affordable price point, with the flexibility of time, which allows them to integrate it with their work and family.

#### Anticipated Timeline

- Fall 2023: COE CBE alternative teacher certification launches
- Spring 2025-Fall 2025: full BPS CBE launch; additional suite of CBE programming launch
- Spring/Summer 2023: identify program suite
  - We are looking for a few further programs --- to match with area demand (actively researching)
  - Possibly: Piedmont Medical; Atrium; Comporium; LPL; Schools; etc.
