- Staff questions concerned contracting out maintenance on campus, why the Hardin Garden fountains have been turned off, athletics' recruiting expenses, overflowing trash cans, raises and promotions, and if the cost of doing national searches for job openings is justified.
- Callie Smith, director of new student and family programs, Student Life, spoke about the upcoming orientation sessions.
