#### Spollight on the West Center

Did you know that faculty/staff West Center memberships are only \$20/month? The West Center offers many amenities for members: basketball courts, racquetball courts, swimming pool, climbing wall, weight room, cardio machines, indoor track, and personal lockers. As a faculty/staff member, you also can take part in <a href="Intramural Sports">Intramural Sports</a> and Group Fitness Classes. All of our student & faculty/staff instructors are certified and excited to teach patrons of all levels. Classes include Zumba, Yoga, Cardio Hip Hop, and Spin. For both programs, our <a href="WU RecSports App">WU RecSports App</a> is used for scheduling and pre-registration. We also offer spouse/partner (\$15/month) and children under the age of 24 (\$10/month) memberships. What differentiates us from other gyms in the area is we have no contract, you can join and cancel at any time, only those having a Winthrop affiliation can join, and our children rate is one set fee regardless of how many children are in your family. Several methods of payment for memberships are offered: payroll deduction, credit card through our online option, or pay by cash/check to our office in 211 West Center. 
