Come See Me Festival

The 2024 Come-See-Me Festival will take place April 11-20 with more than two dozen events at multiple locations around Rock Hill. Check the website https://www.comeseeme.org/ for more details, but below are some events happening on Winthrop's campus.



- Road Races: April 13 (7:30 a.m.–10 a.m.). There will be USATF-certified 5K and 10K races as well as a 1-mile Fun Run. Races will start and end near the Coliseum, and the 5K and 10K courses will go through the neighborhood streets between the Coliseum and main campus and around Glencairn Gardens.
- Gourmet Gardens: April 13 (11 a.m.-4 p.m.). Food trucks and live music around Winthrop Lake.
- Hops at the Park: April 13 (1–6 p.m.). Craft beverages will be available for individual purchase, or you can buy a \$40 ticket for unlimited sampling (must be 21+, and IDs will be checked).
- **Disc Golf Open:** April 14 (8 a.m.–4 p.m.). The tournament will take place at the disc golf course around the Winthrop Lake. There will be divisions for professionals, amateurs, and juniors.
- Moonlight Jazz & Blues: April 19 (6–10 p.m.). Live music near Winthrop Lake. Bring your own chair or blanket, and you can either bring your own picnic and cooler or plan to get food at the cook-off event happening at the same time (see below). Entry is \$5 (cash only) for 21+ or free for under 21.
- Anything But Butts Cook-Off: April 19 (6:30–8 p.m., or earlier if the food runs out). Cook-off competitors will have dishes such as gumbo, tacos, and wings. You can sample dishes for \$1 each, and vote for your favorite entry.
- Barbeque Cook-Off: April 20 (3–6 p.m., or earlier if the food runs out). Area barbeque masters will compete to win the cook-off. Barbeque sandwiches and barbeque by the pound will be available for purchase.
- Tailgate party, Skydiving, & Fireworks: April 20 (3–10 p.m.). The festival finale will include live entertainment until 9 p.m., skydivers at 7 p.m., and fireworks after dark. Bring chairs and coolers, as well as cash for parking (\$5 per car) and for entry (\$5 for 21+ or free for under 21). Check the website for an important list of rules and prohibited items.

Where are WU?

Center for Student Wellness (Health Services)

The Center for Student Wellness has a new location on the third floor of Joynes Hall!

Services Offered

Winthrop University's Health Services is an appointment-based clinic, offering episodic urgent and primary care services. Office visits with registered nurses and nurse practitioners are offered to all eligible students at no charge. Other services like minor office procedures, testing, specimen collection, medication administration, etc. will incur a minimal fee, billed directly to the student's account as "Health Services."



Laboratory: Health Services offers most routine diagnostic laboratory tests either onsite or in partnership with the South Carolina Public Health Laboratory and LabCorp. Tests ordered by an outside provider may be obtained on site and sent to an outside lab for a minimal fee.

Sexual Health Counseling: Students can speak with a healthcare professional about issues related to sexual health, contraception and sexually transmitted infections, and undergo confidential testing in a safe, non-judgmental environment. Confidential test results and your conversation with your provider will become part of your medical record, which is subject to HIPPA privacy standards, and will remain on file only within Health Services. This information cannot be shared with anyone, including your family, friends, or faculty or staff at Winthrop unless you sign the Authorization for Disclosure of Protected Health Information Form.

Travel Clinic: The Winthrop Travel Clinic is a service offered to those who plan to either travel or study abroad. A pre-travel appointment is scheduled to determine your healthcare needs, information about disease risks, as well as health information for your specific destination. Preventive medications and vaccinations are given as needed. Call 803/323-2206 for more information or to set up an appointment.

Hours of Operation

- Fall and Spring Semester: Monday Friday, 8:30 a.m. 4 p.m.; Closed daily for lunch from 12:30 1:30 p.m.
- Summer Semester: By appointment only.
