What drives you every day to make such a difference? To surround our students with a college experience that is positive, nurturing and stress free.

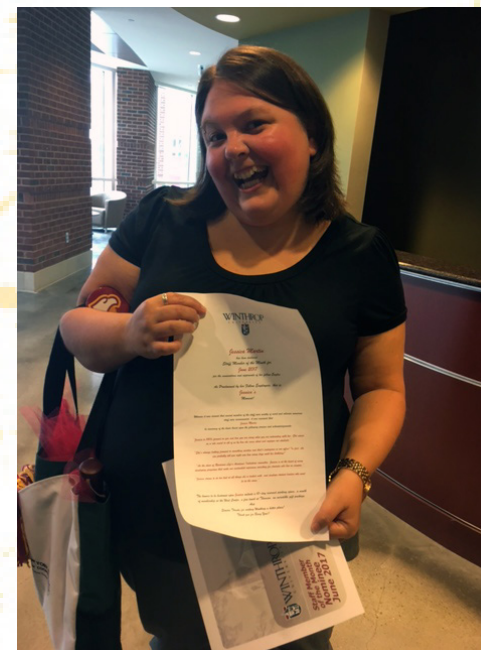
What makes Winthrop special to you? I am able to see the impact of student achievements on a local and national level.
