MLK Jr. Day January 15


There will be no classes and offices will be closed in observance of Martin Luther King Jr. Day.

You've probably seen a lot of work going on both inside and outside of the buildings on campus. James Grigg, Chris Johnson, and the folks at facilities are keeping us in the loop with all these updates!

The End is in Sight:

- Fountain nearly complete, finalizing the donor recognition
- Oakland fence nearly completed we will be removing the leaning oak tree at the exit gate after exams and also completing the tree trimming on Oakland at Eden Terrace
- Library roof work is complete
- Tillman auditorium repairs nearly complete

Current Work:

- West center roof replacement is going well
- Byrnes auditorium abatement is underway
- Boxing repair contractor is remobilizing after having new trim molding fabricated to match the exiting building profiles
- Richardson abatement is in the latter stages, Wofford is still under way. Finalizing design packages for State approval for the demolition/utility relocation phase.

- Stewart House exterior renovation plans are waiting on advertisement by the state.
- Finalizing plans for Joynes roof replacement and McBryde roof replacement.

- Planning residence hall work for summer 2024

Not sure where to find Winthrop data? These fact-loving felines can help!



<u>What the office does</u>: Reports and archives frozen, historical data <u>Go to IR when you need</u>: Official data for completing reports, writing grants, examining trends over time, and/or making comparisons to other institutions or benchmarks

Keep in mind: IR data is always lagging.

<u>Systems IR manages</u>: Online Assessment Reporting System (OARS), Primary Instructor Credentialing System (PICS)

BUSINESS INTELLIGENCE/DATA MANAGEMENT (BIDM)

What the office does: Extracts live, dynamic data from Banner Go to BIDM when you need: Current, up-to-the-minute information for day-to-day operations, especially if it will be needed on a recurring basis

<u>Keep in mind</u>: Live data may have inconsistencies in coding. <u>Systems BIDM manages</u>: WebFocus, Qualtrics, Interfolio, Navigate
