Graff and Birkenstein contend that academic writing never happens in a vacuum but is instead constructed as a dialogue or response to the ideas, writings, and research of others. As a result, it centers around the "they say, I say" model, where your thesis statement functions as the primary, critical "I say" moment in your text, built around and in response to what others "say" about your topic (4).
